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Financial Summary

The following section is provided to give the reader a basic overview of the financial management of the District as it relates to revenue, expenses, and the adopted budget.

District Revenue

For FY10-11, the District established an ad valorem tax rate of \$0.00946 per \$100.00 value which was calculated to generate approximately \$499,406 to be used for the operation of the District. In addition to the tax revenue, the District projected that an additional \$5,000.00 would be realized in earned interest. The District received \$490,313 current year tax collections, \$9,882 delinquent taxes, \$6,074 delinquent penalties and interest, and \$6,528 interest income.

District Expenditures

For FY10-11, the District adopted a budget that had expense accounts totaling \$497,200. These expense accounts were grouped into the following categories: Personnel & Benefits, Commodities, Contractual Services, and Capital Purchases. Below is a table that summarizes the expense by category:

All revenue received but not expended was reserved to be used to pay for the operation of the District in FY11-12 until sufficient tax revenue is collected.

When the proper invoicing and board authorization is provided, the expense will be paid from the current fiscal year budget. Review of the Goals, Objectives, and Performance Standards from the Approved Management Plan

The following section reports on the District's performance in achieving the goals and objectives established in the approved management plan.

The management goals, objectives, and performance standards of the District in the areas specified in 31TAC§356.5 are addressed below.

Providing the Most Efficient Use of Groundwater –31TAC 356.5(a)(1)(A) (Implementing TWC §36.1071(a)(1))

Objective: Develop and maintain a Water Well Registration Program (WWRP) for tracking well information for wells within the District's boundaries.

Performance Standard: Each year, beginning in 2008, the District will summarize within the annual report the changes related to water well registration including the number of new and existing wells registered.

Performance Evaluation: SATISFACTORY

The District has developed and is maintaining its water well registration program and therefore can report on the number of newly registered wells. As of September 2011, the District had registered 587 water wells which is an increase of 209 during FY10-11.

Objective: Develop and maintain a Water Well Permitting Program (WWPP) for tracking all permits authorizing water well operation and groundwater production.

Performance Standard: Each year, beginning in 2008, the District will summarize within the annual report the changes related to water well permitting including the number of new applications and the disposition of the applications.

Performance Evaluation: SATISFACTORY

The District has developed and is maintaining its water well permitting program and therefore can report on the number of new applications or their disposition. Below is a table representing statistics for applications submitted through September 30, 2010. The District anticipates that the registration applications that did not indicate a desire to validate historic use may choose to validate historic use in the future.

The District has satisfactorily met the performance standard of this objective. The District Board was provided updates regarding the drought conditions within the District at regular board meetings. During FY09-10, the District experienced 2 months with drought conditions ranging from abnormally dry to moderate drought.

 - (6) the estimated amount of revenues and balances available to cover the proposal budget; and
 - (7) the estimated tax rate or fee revenues that will be required.
- (c) The annual budget may be amended on the board's approval.

VICTORIA COUNTY GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS September 30, 2011

As management of the Victoria County Groundwater Conservation District (District), we offer readers of the District's financial statements this narrative overview and analysis of the financial activities of the District for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2011. This discussion and analysis is intended to be an easily readable analysis of the District's financial activities based on currently known facts, decisions or conditions. This analysis focuses on current year activities and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements that follow.

Report Layout

In addition to the Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A), the report consists of basic financial statements, notes to the financial statements and supplementary information. The basic financial statements are highly condensed and present a government-wide view of the District's finances. These government-wide statements are designed to be more corporate-like in that all activities are consolidated into a total for the District. The notes to the financial statements provide additional information that is essential to a full understanding of the data provided in the government-wide basic financial statements.

Basic Financial Statements

- The Statement of Net Assets and Governmental Funds Balance Sheet is the first of two governmental
 fund and government-wide financial statements which focus on resources available for future operations.
 In simple terms, this statement presents a snapshot view of the assets the District owns, the liabilities it
 owes and the net difference. The net difference is further separated into amounts restricted for specific
 purposes and unrestricted amounts. The presentation is similar to a private-sector business.
- The second governmental fund and government-wide financial statement is called the Statement of Activities and Governmental Funds Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance/Net Assets. This statement summarizes the District's income and expenditures for the year. Once again, the presentation is similar to a private-sector business.
- The notes to the financial statements provide additional disclosure required by governmental accounting standards and provide information to assist the reader in understanding the District's financial condition.

The discussion and analysis of the District's financial performance provides an overall review of its financial activities for the year ended September 30, 2011. The intent of this discussion and analysis is to look at the District's financial performance as a whole; readers should also review the basic financial statements to enhance their understanding of the District's financial performance.

VICTORIA COUNTY GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS September 30, 2011

Financial Highlights

- The assets of the Victoria County Groundwater Conservation District exceeded its liabilities at the close of the fiscal year ended September 30, 2011 by \$1,237,993. Of this amount, \$1,218,957 in unrestricted net assets is available to meet the District's ongoing obligations.
- At September 30, 2011, unassigned fund balance for the General Fund was \$1,184,958 or 465% of total General Fund expenditures.
- The total cost of all District activities was \$246,387 for the fiscal year.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

Basis of Accounting/Measurement Focus

The accounts of the District are organized on the basis of funds, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund equity, revenues, and expenditures or expenses, as appropriate. Governmental resources are allocated to and accounted for in individual funds based upon the purposes for which they are to be spent and the means by which spending activities are controlled.

The accounting and reporting policies of the District relating to the funds included in the accompanying financial statements conform to generally accepted accounting principles applicable to state and local governments. Generally accepted accounting principles for local governments include those principles prescribed by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB), the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants in the publication entitled *Audits of State and Local Governmental Units*, and by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (when applicable). The more significant accounting policies of the District are described below.

A. Governmental Fund Financial Statements and Government-Wide Financial Statements

The governmental fund financial statements and government-wide financial statements are combined in the Statement of Net Assets and Governmental Funds Balance Sheet and a Statement of Activities and Governmental Funds Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance/Net Assets. These statements present summaries of governmental activities for the District.

Government-wide financial statements are presented on an "economic resources" measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Accordingly, all of the District's assets and liabilities, including capital assets as well as infrastructure assets and long-term liabilities, are included in the accompanying Statement of Net Assets and Governmental Funds Balance Sheet. The Statement of Activities and Governmental Funds Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance/Net Assets presents changes in fund balance/net assets. Under the accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recognized in the period in which they are earned while expenses are recognized in the period in which the liability is incurred. The types of transactions reported as program revenues for the District are reported in two categories: 1) property taxes and 2) investment earnings.

Governmental fund financial statements are presented on a "current financial resources" measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. Accordingly, only current assets and current liabilities are included on the Statement of Net Assets and Governmental Funds Balance Sheet. The Statement of Activities and Governmental Funds Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance/Net Assets present increases (revenues and other financing sources) and decreases (expenditures and other financing uses) in net current assets. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recognized in the accounting period in which they become both measurable and available to finance expenditures of the current period. Accordingly, revenues are recorded when received in cash, except that revenues subject to accrual (generally 60 days after year-end) are recognized when due. The primary revenue sources, which have been treated as susceptible to accrual by the District are charges for property tax and interest income. Expenditures are recorded in the accounting period in which the related fund liability is incurred.

NOTE 1: <u>SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND BASIS OF ACCOUNTING</u> (Continued)

The following is the District's Governmental Fund type:

General Fund

The General Fund is the general operating fund of the District. All financial resources, except those required to be accounted for in another fund, are accounted for in the General Fund.

B. Fund Balance Classification

The governmental fund financial statements present fund balances based on classifications that comprise a hierarchy that is based primarily on the extent to which the District is bound to honor constraints on the specific purposes for which amounts in the respective governmental funds can be spent. The classifications used in the governmental fund financial statements are as follows:

Nonspendable

Amounts that cannot be spent either because they are in nonspendable form or because they are legally or contractually required to be maintained intact.

Restricted

Amounts constrained to specific purposes by their providers, through constitutional provisions, or by enabling legislation.

Committed

Amounts constrained to specific purposes by the District itself, using its highest level of decisionmaking authority, the Board of Directors. To be reported as committed, amounts cannot be used for any other purpose unless the District takes the same highest level action to remove or change the constraint.

Assigned

Amounts the District intends to use for a specific purpose, but does not meet the criteria to be classified as restricted or committed. Intent can be expressed by the Board of Directors or by an official to which the District delegates the authority.

<u>Unassigned</u>

All other spendable amounts.

C. Restricted Resources

The District applies restricted resources when an expense in incurred for purposes for which both restricted and unrestricted net assets are available.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District's cash and cash equivalents are considered to be cash on hand, demand deposits, and certificates of deposits.

NOTE 1: <u>SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND BASIS OF ACCOUNTING</u> (Continued)

E. Budget

The District Board members follow these procedures in establishing the District budgets:

- a. Thirty to sixty days prior to the beginning of each fiscal year, the department supervisors submit to the Board members a proposed budget for the fiscal year beginning on the following October 1. The operating budget includes proposed expenditures and the means of financing them.
- b. Public hearings are conducted at which comments concerning the budget are heard.
- The budget is legally enacted by the Board members prior to the beginning of the fiscal year.
- Any revisions that alter the total expenditures of any fund must be approved by the Board members.

F. Inventory

There is no inventory at September 30, 2011.

G. Vacation and Sick Leave

Vacation accrues at a rate of .83 days per month or ten days per year for all employees. Sick leave accrues at a rate of .42 days per month or five days per year. At year end, accrued vacation was \$4,570 and is included with accrued liabilities. Employees are not entitled to their accrued sick leave if they terminate their employment with the District. Therefore, an accrued liability for sick leave is not recorded.

H. Property Tax

The Appraisal District annually prepares appraisal records listing all property within the District and the appraised value of each parcel or item as of January 1. Additionally on January 1, a tax lien attaches to property to secure the payment of all taxes, penalty, and interest ultimately imposed for the year on the property. By September 1 of each year, or as soon thereafter as practicable, the rate of taxation is set by the Board of Directors of the District based upon the aggregate appraisal value.

Taxes are levied on October 1 and are due and payable on or before January 31 of the following year. All unpaid taxes become delinquent February 1 and attach as an enforceable lien on the property as of July 1 of the following year. The Victoria County Tax Assessor/Collector collects and remits the property taxes to the District on a monthly basis. Property taxes not collected within 60 days are deemed not to be material to the financial statements, so no allowance for doubtful accounts has been established.

Deferred Revenue

The District reports deferred revenue on its General Fund balance sheet. Deferred revenues arise when potential revenue does not meet both the "measurable" and "available" criteria for recognition in the current period. Deferred revenues also arise when the District receives resources before it has legal claim to them. In subsequent periods, when both revenue recognition criteria are met, or when the District has a legal claim to the resources, the liability for deferred revenue is removed from the balance sheet and revenue is recognized.

NOTE 1: <u>SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND BASIS OF ACCOUNTING</u> (Concluded)

J. Capital Assets

Capital assets purchased or acquired are carried at historical cost or estimated historical cost. Contributed assets are recorded at fair market value as of the date donated. Additions, improvements and other capital outlays that significantly extend the useful life of an asset are capitalized. Other costs incurred for repairs and maintenance are expensed as incurred. Depreciation on capital assets is calculated on the straight-line basis over the following estimated useful lives:

Equipment

3-7 years

K. Related Party Transactions

There are no material related party transactions.

L. Contracts

The District and Coleto Creek Watershed entered into a Joint-Funding agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS). The District has agreed to pay \$27,200 towards the project over a course of three years, with payments not to exceed \$10,000 per year.

The District signed a one year umbrella contract with Pastor, Behling & Wheeler, LLC for hydrogeological services which set the rates for services for the year. When the District requires services, they will agree on a joint task order. When these task orders are made, funds become reserved.

NOTE 2: THE FINANCIAL REPORTING ENTITY

Creation of District

The Victoria County Groundwater Conservation District operates with a Board of Directors form of government. The District was created on June 17, 2005 under and subject to the authority, conditions, and restrictions of Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution. It has the same boundaries as Victoria County, which covers an area of 889 square miles and is in the West Gulf Coast Plain of South Texas. The District's mission is to develop, promote, and implement water conservation, augmentation, and management strategies in order to protect water resources for the benefit of the citizens, economy, and environment of Victoria County.

NOTE 3: CASH DEPOSITS WITH FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

State statutes require that all deposits in financial institutions be fully collateralized by U.S. Government obligations or obligations of Texas and its agencies that have a market value of not less than the principal amount of the deposits. The District's deposits were fully collateralized at September 30, 2011. At year-end, the carrying amount of the District's deposits was \$1,225,159 and the respective bank balance totaled \$1,228,533. Of the total bank balance, \$350,585 was covered by Federal Depository Insurance. The remaining \$877,948 was covered by additional securities pledged to the District at September 30, 2011. The fair market value of the pledged securities at year end was \$1,475,541.

Texas Statutes authorize the Victoria County Groundwater Conservation District to invest in:

- 1. Obligations of the U.S. Treasury or its agencies and instrumentalities;
- 2. Direct obligations of the State of Texas of its agencies;
- Other obligations, the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed or insured by the State of Texas or the United States;
- 4. Obligations of states, agencies, counties, or cities rated A or better by a national investment rating firm;
- 5. Certificates of deposit that are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or secured by obligations having a market value of at least the principal amount of the certificates; and
- 6. Fully collateralized direct repurchase agreements.

The District leases office space from Victoria County, Texas for \$1,080 per month plus a potential increase from year to year for lessor's increased amount of maintenance, repair, cleanup, and utilities provided, however, such increase shall not be more than five percent in any lease year. The lease expires on March 31, 2016.

NOTE 6: RISK MANAGEMENT

The District is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to and destruction of assets, errors and omissions, injuries to employees and natural disasters. During the year ended September 30, 2011, the District purchased commercial insurance to cover these risks.

NOTE 7: ADJUSTMENTS

The adjustments on the Statement of Net Assets and Governmental Funds Balance Sheet are to add the fixed assets net of accumulated depreciation and record all taxes as earned rather than deferred.

The adjustments to the Statement of Activities and Governmental Funds Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance/Net Assets are to record the difference in deferred revenues at the beginning and end of the year, to record capital outlay expenditures as capital assets, and to record depreciation expense for the year.

NOTE 8: OTHER DISCLOSURES

Tax Revenues

The tax rate for 2010/2011 was \$0.00946 per \$100 valuation. The taxable value was \$5,266,145,412. All tax monies are used for maintenance and operations.

Location of District

The District is located in Victoria County, Texas. The general membership of the Board is elected within the District.

NOTE 9: RETIREMENT PLAN

The District provides retirement benefits for their respective full-time employees through nontraditional defined benefit plans in the state-wide Texas County and District Retirement System (TCDRS). The Board of Trustees of TCDRS is responsible for the administration of the statewide agent multiple-employer public employee retirement system consisting of 601 nontraditional defined benefit pension plans. TCDRS in the aggregate issues a comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR) on a calendar year basis. The CAFR is available upon written request from the TCDRS Board of Trustees at P.O. Box 2034, Austin, Texas, 78768-2034.

NOTE 9: RETIREMENT PLAN (Concluded)

The plan provisions are adopted by the Board of Directors, within the options available in the state statutes governing TCDRS (TCDRS Act). Employees can retire regardless of age with 30 years of service. The "Rule of 80" will determine retirement eligibility. Members are vested after 10 years but must leave their accumulated contributions in the plans to receive any employer-financed benefit. Members who withdraw their personal contributions in a lump-sum are not entitled to any amounts contributed by their employer.

Benefit amounts are determined by the sum of the employee's contributions to the plan, with interest, and employer-financed monetary credits. The level of these monetary credits is adopted by the Board of Directors within the constraints imposed by the TCDRS Act so that the resulting benefits can be expected to be adequately financed by the employer's commitment to contribute. At retirement the benefit is calculated by converting the sum of the employee's accumulated contribution and the employer-financed monetary credits to a monthly annuity using annuity purchase rates prescribed by the TCDRS Act.

Funding Policy

The District elected the annually determined contribution rate (Variable-Rate) plan provisions of the TCDRS Act. The plans are funded by monthly contributions from both employee members and the employer based on the covered payroll of employee members. Under the TCDRS Act, the contribution rate of the employer is actuarially determined annually. The contribution rate was 4.10% for 2010.

The contribution rate payable by the employee members for calendar year 2010 is the rate of 5% as adopted by the Board of Directors. The employee contribution rate and the employer contribution rate may be changed by the Board of Directors within the options available in the TCDRS Act.

Annual Pension Cost

The required contribution was determined as part of the December 31, 2010 actuarial valuation using the entry age actuarial cost method. The actuarial assumptions at December 31, 2010 include (a) 8.0 percent investment return (net of administrative expenses), and (b) projected salary increases of 5.4 percent. Both (a) and (b) included an inflation component of 3.5 percent. The actuarial value of assets was determined using techniques that spread the effects of short-term volatility in the market value of investments over a ten-year period. The unfunded actuarial accrued liability is being amortized as a level percentage of projected payroll on a closed basis. The remaining amortization period at December 31, 2010 was 20 years.

Funded Status and Funding Progress

As of December 31, 2010, the most recent actuarial valuation date, the plan was 77.7 percent funded. The actuarial accrued liability for benefits was \$19,903, and the actuarial value of assets was \$15,464, resulting in an unfunded actuarial accrued liability (UAAL) of \$4,439. The covered payroll was \$87,297 and the ratio of the UAAL to the covered payroll was 5.08 percent.

The schedule of funding progress, presented as Required Supplementary Information following the notes to the financial statements, presents multi-year trend information about whether the actuarial value of plan assets in increasing or decreasing over time relative to the actuarial accrued liability for benefits.

Desired Future Conditions of the Gulf Coast Aquifer

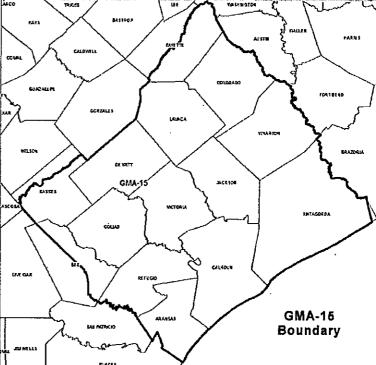
Following proper notice and a public hearing on July 14, 2010, the members of Groundwater Management Area 15 (GMA-15) adopted the initial Desired Future Condition (DFC) for the groundwater resources within its boundary. The GMA-15 DFC describes the maximum acceptable level

of aquifer drawdown for the Gulf Coast

"... groundwater within GMA
15 shall be managed in such a
way as to achieve a Desired
Future Condition in 2060 of no
more than 12 feet of average
drawdown of the Gulf Coast
Aquifer in the GMA 15 boundary relative to 1999 starting
conditions..."

GMA-15, not unlike most of the GMAs around the State, considered a wide range of issues and interests as it developed and adopted the GMA-15 DFC: urban interests, rural interests, historic groundwater uses, future groundwater uses, regional water planning needs, aquifer variability, droughts, and computer modeling limitations. The GMA-15 DFC represents the best solution to these issues for this region of the Gulf Coast. GMA-15 will revise, as necessary the DFC in five years, if not sooner.

With the submission of the GMA-15 DFC to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB), TWDB will compute available groundwater estimates referred to as Managed Available Groundwater (MAG) values for each county and supply those to the GCDs



within the GMA-15. The GCDs are required to incorporate the MAGs into their management and permitting programs.

Projected Population Growth and Water Needs

It's a fact recognized by most Texans: Texas is growing. The TWDB projects Texas' population at 2060 to be approximately 46 million. This estimate represents a 21 million person increase above the population projection for 2010. What is projected for Victoria County? Victoria County is growing as well with a projected population increase of 34% by 2060 compared to 2010 estimates (www.twdb.state.tx.us/wrpi/data/proj/2012popproj.asp). Along with the growth, Texas is realizing an increased demand for resources — especially in terms of water — for both personal use and industrial consumption. The table below summarizes the population, water demand, and water needs associated with the projected future growth in Victoria County (www.regionltexas.org/2011_rwp2.php).

Through the regional water planning process, the various water management strategies have been developed to address the region's needs. Water Conservation Information and Suggestions

Water management strategies identified to help address the future shortfalls in the Region L 2011 regional water plan rightfully include water conservation. Water conservation is an environmentally-sensitive approach to managing water resources at the regional level; certain methods of water conservation are appropriate at the individual level in all areas of Texas such as proper maintenance of plumbing fixtures, effective lawn watering, shorter showers, and rainwater harvesting (www.twdb.state.tx.us/iwt/rainwater.asp).

Other water conservation approaches may only be appropriate on larger scales or particular geographic locations such as recharge enhancement (Section 4C.4 of the Region L 2011 Regional Water Plan).

Victoria County property owners may benefit from a variety of groundwater conservation or protection activities ranging from well maintenance to brush management. AGENDA ITEM NO. 1: Public Comment

Alan Cockerell, Schertz-Seguin Local Government Council, briefed the Planning Group on a potential new expansion project in the Wilcox formation to develop a brackish desalination project for the next planning cycle.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2: Approval of Minutes

Chairman Con Mims asked if there were any corrections to be made to the minutes. Evelyn Bonavita asked that a correction be made to Agenda Item No. 7 of the minutes. Mr. Mims asked for a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. Ron Naumann made a motion to approve the minutes. Mike Mahoney seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 3: Status of the Edwards Aquifer Recovery Implementation Program (EARIP)

Dr. Robert Gulley, EARIP, provided an update on EARIP activities to the Planning Group. An EARIP meeting was held on October 21, 2010 with the objective of coming together as a group to agree on a package of actions for the phased process of the Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) for EARIP consultants to work with. Dr. Gulley also presented an informational slide regarding estimated costs for certain EARIP activities, as well as a slide reflecting a "bottom up" package for Comal Springflow during the drought of record.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 4: Chair's Report

Mr. Mims informed the Planning Group he would be speaking to the League of Women's Voters on November 6, 2010 and Texas Water Law Institute on December 3, 2010 regarding the 2011 Regional Water Plan (RWP) and will be participating with the Texas River Institute's briefing of Legislative staffers on December 6, 2010. Steve Raabe stated a briefing on the 2011 RWP will be presented to the EARIP in December.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 5: Replacement of Planning Group Member

Mr. Mims informed the Planning Group that one nomination was received for the Industries vacancy on the Planning Group. Mr. Mims introduced Rey Chavez, President/CEO, San Antonio Manufacturer's Association (SAMA), as the nominee. Mr. Mahoney made a motion to approve the nomination of Mr. Chavez for the Industries position. Mr. Naumann seconded the motion. The motion passed by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6: Discussion and Appropriate Action Authorizing Administrator to Solicit Nominations for Vacant Planning Group Position

Mr. Mims informed the Planning Group he has received two letters of resignation to the Region L Planning Group. The letters were sent by Velma Danielson and Jay Millikin representing Water Districts and Counties, respectively. Mr. Mims also stated he received notice by Garrett Engelking, a Water Districts representative, that he is no longer eligible to represent Water Districts. Mr. Mims asked the Planning Group if they would like to fill all three vacancies at this time. The Planning Group agreed to fill all three positions. Bill West made a motion to approve authorizing the Administrator to solicit nominations for three vacancies on the Planning Group. Mr. Mahoney seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 7: Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) Communications

Matt Nelson, TWDB, stated all regional water plans have been submitted on time to TWDB. TWDB staff will present regional plans to the Board for approval at the October, November and December TWDB Board of Directors meetings. Region L will be in the last group of plans presented in December. The State Water Plan will then be put together for delivery to Legislators in 2012.

Mr. Nelson reminded the Planning Group the current contract will expire effective January 31, 2011. At this time, TWDB does not expect to know how much funds will be available for regional water planning for the next phase until May 2011. In anticipation of assumed amount of funds, TWDB will begin preparing Solicitation for Applications for funds available for the 1st biennium of the 2016 RWP. A new procurement process for Technical Consultants will be

expected. The Planning Group will need to solicit new Technical Consultants for professional services for the 1st phase of the planning process. This action may take place at the Planning Group's discretion. Mr. Raabe asked Mr. Nelson when he estimates completed grant applications will be due to TWDB. Mr. Nelson estimated Request for Proposals to go out to Planning Groups after May 2011 with deadlines for completed grant applications sometime in the summer.

Mr. Nelson also informed the Planning Group that TWDB will release non-population water demand projections, such as mining projections, in March 2011. The draft reports will be available on the TWDB website for viewing and comments. Mr. Nelson will inform the Administrator when reports become available.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 8: Discussion and Appropriate Action Regarding Consultants' Work and Schedule

Brian Perkins, HDR Engineering, briefed the Planning Group on actions taken to finalize the Regional Water Plan. HDR Engineering submitted the final plan to TWDB on schedule. The final plan has also been delivered to all Region L counties, as well as county libraries, in electronic format. The plan is available on the Region L website at www.RegionLTexasl.org.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 9: Review/Approve Administrator's 2011 Budget

Erin Newberry, SARA, reviewed the proposed administrator's budget for 2011 with the Planning Group. The budget is operated on a calendar year basis. The Administrator has proposed the budget remain the same as the 2010 budget, \$58,000.00. Administrative costs are funded and agreed upon through an interlocal agreement with several entities involved in the Region L planning process. The current interlocal agreement expires December 31, 2011. A new interlocal agreement will be drafted by the Administrator this year. Mr. West made a motion to approve the budget for 2011 at \$58,000.00. Gary Middleton seconded the motion. The motion passed by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 10: Eagle Ford Shale Oil and Gas Development – Effects on Groundwater – Darrell T. Brownlow, Ph.D.

Darrell Brownlow presented a detailed presentation on groundwater usage related to hydraulic fracturing and the implications on aquifers in South Texas, such as the Carrizo Aquifer. Dr. Brownlow reminded the Planning Group that any opinions in the presentation are strictly his own.

Joy Lizarraga, USGS, presented the Groundwater/Surface Water Interaction Study, Gain/Loss Study on the Lower San Antonio River Basin and Guadalupe River, being conducted by USGS and funded by several entities involved in the Region L water planning process.

There were no public comments at this time.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2: Approval of Minutes

Chairman Con Mims asked if there were any corrections to be made to the minutes. Evelyn Bonavita asked that a correction be made to Agenda Item No. 2 of the minutes, reflecting the appropriate title, "League of Women Voters". Mr. Mims asked for a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. Ms. Bonavita made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. Ron Naumann seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 3: Status of the Edwards Aquifer Recovery Implementation Program (EARIP)

Dr. Robert Gulley, EARIP, provided an update of EARIP activities to the Planning Group. The EARIP has continued to work on the final plan and development of the Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP). Part of the package EARIP is charged with completing is to find funding to implement the final plan and processes. The EARIP has been discussing strategies to propose funding for implementation. Three options under consideration are potential federal funding through grants programs, regional funding divided equally between pumpers and non-pumpers, and/or a regional sales tax. Dr. Gulley stated the statute requires a final HCP, to include demonstrating adequate funding is available for implementation of the HCP. U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services will not be able to approve the final plan if the EARIP is unable to demonstrate that adequate funding of any actions proposed within the final HCP is available.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 4: Chair's Report

Mr. Mims informed the Planning Group two errata's to the 2011 Regional Water Plan have been posted to the Region L website and provided to TWDB by HDR Engineering. Neither errata's affect the plan, but were slight editing corrections.

Mr. Mims asked Robert Puente to provide a brief update on SAWS' new water supply contract, importing water from Gonzales County through existing pipelines, rather than building new pipelines. Mr. Puente stated the regional partnership between all parties involved, to include Schertz-Seguin Local Government Corporation (SSLGC), the cities of Schertz, Nixon, and Seguin contributed to the overall success of the project.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 5: Election of Planning Group Officers and At-Large Executive Committee Members for 2011

Mr. Mims opened the floor to nominations for Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, and two At-Large positions to serve for 2011. Milton Stolte made a motion to nominate the current Executive Committee Members. Mr. Puente seconded the motion. The current Executive Committee Members agreed to serve another term. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6: Replacement of Planning Group Members

Mr. Mims informed the Planning Group that he received a call from David Langford, who currently represents the Agricultural interest on the Planning Group. Mr. Langford is stepping down from his position on Region L effective immediately. Mr. Langford's term expires August 2011 and will be open for nominations at that time. Mr. Mims asked the Planning Group if they would like to solicit to fill the vacancy at this time, or wait until the nomination process begins at the May 5, 2011 meeting at which time the administrator will request authorization to begin the nomination process for expiring terms. The members stated their preference to wait for the next nomination process in May.

Mr. Mims informed the Planning Group four nominations were received for the two vacant Water District positions and three nominations were received for one vacancy in Counties. The Executive Committee met on January 20, 2011 to conduct interviews with all nominees. The Executive Committee recommends Karl Dreher, General Manager, Edwards Aquifer Authority

and Greg Sengelmann, General Manager, Gonzales County Underground Water District to represent the interest category, Water Districts, in the two vacancies. The Executive Committee then recommended Commissioner Will Conley, Hays County Commissioner, to represent Counties in the Counties interest category.

Tom Taggart made a motion to approve the Executive Committee's nominations for all three vacancies. Tony Wood seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 7: Status of Guadalupe, San Antonio, Mission, and Aransas Rivers and Mission, Copano, Aransas, and San Antonio Bays Basin and Bay Stakeholder Committee (BBASC) and Expert Science Team (BBEST)

Suzanne Scott, Chair of BBASC, provided a brief history of the BBASC charge, as well as the many processes the Expert Science Team studies to develop their recommendation report to the Stakeholder Committee. The BBASC has been charged to review the environmental flow analyses and environmental flow regime recommendations submitted by the Expert Science Team (BBEST) and consider them in conjunction with other factors, including present and future needs for water for other uses related to water supply planning in the pertinent river basin and bay system. BBASC shall develop recommendations regarding environmental flow standards and strategies to meet the environmental flow standards and submit those recommendations to Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and the Texas Environmental Flows Advisory Group.

Ms. Scott informed the Planning Group the Expert Science Team will submit their final report/recommendations, which will be based on best available science, to the Stakeholder Committee by March 1, 2011. The Stakeholder Committee will then use the recommendations to develop their final recommendation report to TCEQ. The BBASC meets next March 2, 2011 at SAWS.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 8: Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) Communications

Matt Nelson, TWDB, informed the Planning Group Kevin Ward, TWDB Executive Administrator, is leaving TWDB and the Interim Executive Administrator will be Melanie Callahan.

Mr. Nelson gave a brief update on the upcoming fourth cycle regional water planning cycle and initial funding available to planning groups to begin developing the 2016 Regional Water Plan (RWP). Mr. Nelson stated population estimates from the new census may be available by the end of the year, which will then be broken down to cities and counties by the state demographer. TWDB will provide draft numbers early 2012, but non-population numbers will be available this summer. The Managed Available Groundwater numbers (total pumping numbers) may be available in December 2011 or January 2012.

Mr. Nelson Informed the Planning Group a summary of all regional water plans is now available on the TWDB website for review.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 9: Discussion and Appropriate Action to Authorize Administrator to Provide Public Notice and Submit a Grant Application for Regional Planning Grant Funding to TWDB for the Fourth Cycle of Regional Water Planning

Mr. Mims asked Mr. Nelson to provide background on the grant application process, as well as the initial scope of work TWDB has provided to begin developing the 2016 RWP. Mr. Nelson confirmed TWDB will provide opportunity for planning group's to comment and negotiate on draft population numbers and water demands during the fourth cycle planning process within their areas, using new census numbers.

Mike Fields made a motion to approve authorizing administrator to provide public notice and submit a grant application for regional planning grant funding to TWDB for the fourth cycle of regional water planning. Mr. Stolte seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 10: Discussion and Appropriate Action to Authorize Administrator to Provide Public Notice and Hold a Public Meeting to Take Input for the Scope of Work for Region L for the Fourth Cycle of Regional Water Planning

Mr. Mims asked for a motion approving authorizing administrator to provide public notice and hold a public meeting to take input for the scope of work for Region L for the fourth cycle of regional water planning. John Kight made a motion to approve. Mr. Fields seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 11: Discussion and Appropriate Action Authorizing Administrator to Solicit Requests for Proposal for Regional Water Planning Consultant Services

Erin Newberry, San Antonio River Authority (SARA), discussed the re-solicitation process for consultant services for the fourth cycle of regional water planning. The Request for Proposal will be based on draft scope of work and Initial funding currently provided by TWDB. Mrs. Newberry asked the Planning Group to provide direction on several items for the solicitation process.

Mrs. Newberry briefed that SARA, as administrator for Region L, would like to solicit for one agreement with a consultant team or firm that could provide all consultant services deemed necessary by the planning group during the planning process (technical, public participation and/or facilitation). The Planning Group agreed one agreement with a primary consultant would be more efficient. The Planning Group also agreed the RFP should be for technical consultant services; however, sub-contracting for other services may be needed at a later date and should be based on Planning Group approval of such services.

The Planning Group selected seven Planning Group members to serve as a Selection Committee, to review submissions, interview firms and bring back a consultant recommendation to the May 5, 2011 meeting. At that time, the Planning Group will make a final selection for consultant services. The Selection Committee will be Mr. Dreher, Mr. Mims, Mr. Puente, Mr. West, Ms. Bonavita, Mr. Taggart, and Mrs. Scott.

Mrs. Newberry also presented a draft of SARA's standard evaluation criteria for RFP's in the agenda packet. The Planning Group reviewed the criteria and suggested minor revisions.

Donna Balin asked if the criteria could specify all submitting firms should disclose any existing contracts for projects within Region L that could be a conflict of interest. Mrs. Scott stated just because a consultant firm may have a contract with an entity within Region L, it is not necessarily deemed a conflict of interest. The process of selecting a consultant should be done in the spirit of full disclosure. Any consultant firm submitting a proposal should disclose their contracts with entities in the region in a show of full disclosure; however it shouldn't be recognized that if that firm has contracts with entities within the region, it would be considered a conflict of interest by the Selection Committee.

Mr. Mims stated Mrs. Newberry can draft the RFP, as well as the evaluation criteria and forward to the Selection Committee for final review before posting the RFP. This action was acceptable to the planning group.

Mr. Kight made a motion to approve authorizing administrator to solicit Requests for Proposals for Regional Water Planning Consultant Services. Mr. Wood seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

Humberto Ramos, Bexar Metropolitan Water District, introduced Tom Gallier, the new Interim General Manager for Bexar Metropolitan Water District.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2: Approval of Minutes

Chairman Con Mims asked if there were any corrections to the minutes or a motion to approve the minutes. Gary Middleton made a motion to approve the minutes. Ron Naumann seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 3: Status of the Edwards Aquifer Recovery Implementation Program (EARIP)

Dr. Robert Gulley, EARIP, provided an update of EARIP activities to the Planning Group. The EARIP has developed a good, valuable plan. The funding is divided into two approaches – the first is a regional vote on a possible sales tax to fund the Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP). The EARIP was able to get a hearing with the House of Natural Resources and presented their case for the proposed regional sales tax. The second approach was coming up with a mechanism to fund the HCP within the region; dividing the cost between the pumpers and the non-pumpers. Meetings have been held since early December 2010 regarding this option with both sides continuing communications. Though some suggestions within the EARIP have been to delay the HCP until after the 2013 Legislation Session due to funding issues within the region, the overall consensus is to continue working towards a solution, stay on schedule meeting deadlines in Senate Bill (SB) 3 and come up with a plan that will satisfy the requirements of the Endangered Species Act. Discussions continue within the EARIP to search for creative ways to fund the HCP.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 4: Chair's Report

Mr. Mims had no report at the time, but asked Bill West to discuss any legislation effecting regional water planning. Mr. West stated the largest issue at this time is the budget and potential funds available through the Texas Water Development Board for water projects through loans.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 5: Status of Guadalupe, San Antonio, Mission, and Aransas Rivers and Mission, Copano, Aransas and San Antonio Bays Basin and Bay Stakeholder Committee (BBASC) and Expert Science Team (BBEST)

Suzanne Scott, Chair of the Guadalupe, San Antonio, Mission, and Aransas Rivers and Mission, Copano, Aransas and San Antonio BBASC, provided an update of what BBASC is currently working on. The BBASC has received the report from the BBEST and is reviewing the report, which is extremely comprehensive and complex. The next step for the BBASC will be to take the information from the report and begin to understand the science and how it relates to preserving and protecting the ecology of the rivers, bays and estuaries. The group must also take the science and apply it to human needs for water, to include water supply.

The BBASC has hired a Technical Consultant to apply BBEST flow regime recommendations to various scenarios, both real and hypothetical, to assist stakeholders in understanding how the recommendations are applied and the potential effects.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6: Discussion and Appropriate Action Regarding Authorizing Administrator to Begin Soliciting Nominations for SCTRWPG Voting Members Whose Terms Expire in August 2011 (13 members)

Erin Newberry, SARA, informed the Planning Group that there will be thirteen voting members whose terms expire in August 2011. Ms. Newberry asked the Planning Group for authorization for the Administrator to begin soliciting nominations for the upcoming vacancies.

Ron Naumann made a motion to approve authorizing the administrator to begin the process to solicit nominations for the thirteen vacancies. Gary Middleton seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 7: Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) Communications

Matt Nelson, TWDB, provided an update to the Planning Group on the next steps the Planning Group will be taking for the next round of regional water planning. Mr. Nelson stat d the Application for Funding for all sixteen regional water groups will be going before their board in June to ask authorization to begin negotiating and executing contracts for regional water planning grants for the next round. The grant contract will be executed with the Administrator for Region L, the San Antonio River Authority, by August 31, 2011.

Mr. Nelson informed the Planning Group the next round will be different from the last round of regional water planning in that all projections will be revisited from scratch. The planning period will be extended to 2070. The mining projections are available on the TWDB website now for review and comments.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 8: CONVENE PUBLIC MEETING to Receive Public Input on issues that Should be Addressed or Provisions that Should be Included in the Regional or State Water Plan for the Fourth Cycle of Regional Water Planning (Public Meeting Notice Posted Separately on February 18, 2011)

At this time, 10:45 am, Mr. Mims recessed the Region L meeting and convened the Public Meeting.

Mr. Mims convened the public meeting to receive public input on issues that should be addressed or provisions that should be included in the Regional or State Water Plan for the fourth cycle of regional water planning. Mr. Mims received three comment cards.

C. Thomas Koch, P.E., asked the Planning Group to address the assumed cap to be placed on the availability of water from the Trinity Aquifer for water users in Comal County. Mr. Koch stated throughout the first three rounds of regional water planning the cap has been set at less than 1,600 acre-feet per year. This is equivalent to limiting the production from all wells withdrawing water from the Trinity Aquifer in Comal County so that the total production is less than 1,600 gpm, assuming each well is operated 62% of the time. The assumed cap is an issue that needs to be addressed early in the fourth round of regional water planning.

Mr. Koch stated current withdrawals in Comal County already exceed the Region L assumed cap several fold. Comal County is one of the fastest growing counties in Region L and in the future will face a water shortage. The assumed cap on Trinity Aquifer water availability in Comal will determine the year that a major multi-hundred-million dollar water supply project will need to be financed and constructed.

Two Groundwater Management Areas cover Comal County, GMA 9 and GMA 10; which have adopted Desired Future Conditions and preliminary estimates of Managed Available Groundwater for permitting from the Trinity Aquifer. These estimates are substantially different from the assumed cap used in the 2011 Regional Water Plan. The estimates of GMA 9 and GMA 10 need to be incorporated into the regional water plan so water users can plan for future water needs with more certainty than presently exists.

Mr. Koch presented his second public comment on behalf of th Bexar Medina Atascosa Counties Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 ("BMA"). BMA requests that it be included as a Wholesale Water Provider in the fourth round of regional water planning. BMA fulfills the requirements of a wholesale water provider since it has contract for delivery of 19,974 acre-feet per year of municipal water from Medina Lake (via bed and banks of the Medina River) to Bexar Metropolitan Water District. The term of the contract is from January 1, 2008 and continues through December 31, 2049.

Mr. Koch delivered his written comments, in the form of two letters, to Ms. Newberry.

Alan Cockerell, General Manager Schertz-Seguin Local Government Corporation (SSLGC), announced a new organization has been formed to work in conjunction with SSLGC, the Cibolo Valley Local Government Corporation (CVLGC). Five cities have joined Cibolo Valley LGC, Cibolo, Converse, Schertz, Seguin and Selma. The Cibolo Valley LGC will work with SSLGC to complete the Guadalupe County portion of the Regional Carrizo for SSLGC for expansion project, a water management strategy included in the 2011 Regional Water Plan. Both entities will also work together to design and develop the Regional Carrizo/Brackish Wilcox SSLGC Expansion Water Management Strategy which was introduced in the last planning cycle and reflects as a project that requires further study. The entitles will work together towards this project becoming a Recommended Strategy.

Kirk Holland, General Manager Barton Springs Edwards Aquifer Conservation District, which is in both Region K and Region L asked for the Planning Group to give serious consideration to brackish groundwater desalination, especially in the Edwards Aquifer. Mr. Holland believes this is a water management strategy whose time has come and Region L can be a catalyst to help overcome of the obstacles regarding Edwards Aquifer desalination.

Mr. Mims asked if there were any additional public comments. As there were none at this time, Mr. Mims closed the Public Meeting at 10:55 am.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 9: Discussion and Appropriate Action Regarding Consultant Selection for the Fourth Cycle of Regional Water Planning

Mr. Mims provided an updated on the selection process for consultant selection for the fourth round of regional water planning. One proposal for consultant services was received from HDR Engineering, Inc. The selection committee reviewed the proposal and is recommending that HDR Engineering, Inc. be approved as Region L's consultant for the fourth cycle of regional water planning.

Milton Stolte made a motion to approve HDR Engineering, Inc. as the selected consultant for Region L for the fourth cycle of regional water planning. Mr. Middleton seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 10: Discussion and Appropriate Action Authorizing Administrator to Enter Into a Contract with TWDB for Fourth Cycle Regional Water Planning

Ms. Newberry presented the draft task budget for initial regional water planning from TWDB and requested Planning Group authorization for SARA, as Administrator, to negotiate and enter into a contract with TWDB for the grant contract. The draft task budget has been set at

\$306,119.00, which will assist in developing the Technical Memorandum and the regional water plan. The contract must be executed by August 31, 2011.

Mr. Middleton made a motion to authorize SARA, as Region L's Administrator, to negotiate and enter into a contract with TWDB for Fourth Cycle Regional Water Planning. Mr. Naumann seconded the motion. The motion carried by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 3: Status of the Edwards Aquifer Recovery Implementation Program (EARIP)

Dr. Robert Gulley, EARIP, provided an update of EARIP activities to the Planning Group. Dr. Gulley stated a recommendation will be made on the plan for addressing the Endangered Species Act. The EARIP members have reached an agreement on the plan and a funding mechanism to implement the project. The members are currently waiting to review the

documents – the complete draft of the Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) and the Implementing Agreement. A final recommendation may be ready for review by the Edwards Aquifer Authority (EAA) October 12, 2011. After reviewing the recommendations, the EAA must make a decision to accept or reject the recommendation.

Temple McKinnon, TWDB, provided a report on the modification of Senate Bill 660 which requires that, in addition to the representation of the 11 interest groups currently required by statute, each Regional Water Planning Group (RWPG) will now have to maintain additional representation for each Groundwater Management Area (GMA) from a Groundwater Conservation District located within the regional water planning area and the GMA that is at least partially located within the regional water planning area. Senate Bill 660 will take effect on September 1, 2011.

Region L has five GMAs within its region – GMA 7, GMA 9, GMA 10, GMA 13 and GMA 15. Each Groundwater Conservation District in the GMA is responsible for informing the Planning Group of the appointed GMA representative. RWPGs must accept the individuals appointed by the GCDs in the GMAs without a vote or other confirmation by other RWPG members and the newly appointed representative is a voting member of the RWPG.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6: Replacement of Planning Group Members

Mr. Mims informed the Planning Group the Executive Committee met to review the nomination packages and interview nominees for the thirteen vacancies on the Planning Group at this time, two of which are vacancies and eleven expired terms. The thirteen vacancies are in the following Interests: 2 River Authorities, 1 Water Districts, 3 Municipalities, 2 Environmental, 1 Counties, 1 Industries, 2 Agricultural, 1 Electric Generating Utilities.

The Executive Committee recommended the reappointment of current incumbents as follows: Con Mims and Bill West, River Authorities; Mike Mahoney, Water Districts; Gary Middleton, Robert Puente and Tom Taggart, Municipalities; Iliana Pena and Donna Balin, Environmental; John Kight, Counties; Rey Chavez, Industries; and Milton Stolte, Agricultural.

The Executive Committee recommended Alan Cockerell to the Agricultural position and Kevin Janak to the Electric Generating Utilities position.

Gary Middleton made a motion to approve the Executive Committee's recommendations for all thirteen vacancies. Bill West seconded the motion. The motion passed by consensus.

All thirteen vacancies terms will expire in 2016.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 7: Status of Guadalupe, San Antonio, Mission, and Aransas Rivers and Mission, Copano, Aransas and San Antonio Bays Basin and Bay Stakeholder Committee (BBASC) and Expert Science Team (BBEST) and Nueces River and Corpus Christi and Baffin Bays Stakeholder Committee (BBASC) and Expert Science Team (BBEST)

Suzanne Scott, Chair of the Guadalupe, San Antonio, Mission, and Aransas Rivers and Mission, Copano, Aransas and San Antonio BBASC, provided an overview to the Planning Group of the BBASC draft recommendations accomplished so far. Ms. Scott explained each level of a recommendation for flow regimes at several gage locations (subsistence flows, base flows, pulses, etc.), using the San Antonio River recommendations for flow regimes as an example for the 16 gage sites the stakeholder group is developing flow regime recommendations for. Though the recommendations are complex, the stakeholder committee strives to balance environmental needs and human needs while structuring the flow recommendations.

Ms. Scott discussed the balancing issues the stakeholder group is currently discussing regarding the bays and estuaries recommendations. Ms. Scott provided background on the methodology used and attainment criteria provided by the BBEST and the reasoning behind the BBEST recommendations for the bays and estuaries. The BBASC stakeholder group is currently working through their draft recommendations for the bays and estuaries while taking all issues into consideration, such as habitat, seasonal flows, current permits, etc.

Mr. Mims reminded the Planning Group this recommendation process is going on throughout the state with several stakeholder groups, but all eyes are currently on Ms. Scott's stakeholder group. Ms. Scott also informed the Planning Group the recommendation report will include recommended strategies the stakeholder group will work on.

Mr. Mims also reiterated the BBASC Instream Flow Recommendations, the new census, the EARIP and the Managed Available Groundwater actions will significantly impact the planning process for the 2016 RWP.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 8: Discussion and Appropriate Action Regarding Consultant Work and Schedule

Brian Perkins, HDR Engineering, provided a draft working schedule for the Planning Group which outlines the schedule of tasks to be completed for the planning process. Mr. Perkins provided a schedule based on each task and dates information will be due to TWDB during the planning process phase. Mr. Perkins briefly reviewed how HDR will evaluate water availability and existing water supplies and needs, as well as considering EARIP and BBASC recommendations and how they will affect water availability and supplies. The consultant schedule will be updated and briefed on at each Planning Group meeting.

Mr. Perkins provided a brief update on his review of the University of Texas Bureau of Economic Geology (BEG) Mining Report on Projected Water Use as requested by the Planning Group at the May meeting. Mr. Perkins provided general comments on the projected water use amounts within Region L and specific comments on the BEG report to Mr. Mims for his review and approval to be forwarded to TWDB.

The Planning Group had several questions regarding county numbers TWDB has estimated, specifically regarding current mining within Region L counties. Mr. Perkins informed the Planning Group the numbers under discussion today came straight from the final BEG report. These numbers do not represent what TWDB will use as the final mining projections. The Planning Group still has the opportunity to provide comments to the TWDB before the final mining projections for Region L are released. Ms. McKinnon confirmed the Planning Group still has time to review the mining use numbers from the BEG Report and provide comments to TWDB. At this time, Planning Groups must provide comments on all projections (municipal, mining, population, non-municipal) to TWDB by July 2012, tentatively.

Mr. Perkins also provided an update on the draft modeled available groundwater (MAG) numbers available within Region L. Mr. Perkins stated the numbers are draft only and not final, but will affect the planning process as well. Darrell Brownlow expressed to the Planning Group that having just completed the Desired Future Conditions (DFC) process, there are substantial differences between numbers was used in the 2011 RWP versus what should be considered in the next round of planning

Mr. Mims suggested we place an item on the next planning group meeting to discuss the draft projections provided by the BEG report, as well as the draft projections TWDB will be sending to the regional water planning groups. The agenda item may cover how the projections were developed by TWDB and any other information that will assist the planning group on understanding how the projections will affect the planning process.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 9: Discussion and Appropriate Action to Authorize Administrator to Negotiate and Execute Interlocal Agreement for Funding of SB1 Region L Administrative Costs, 2012 – 2016

Erin Newberry, San Antonio River Authority (SARA), provided a draft Interlocal Agreement for Funding of SB1 Region L Administrative Costs, 2012 – 2016 for Planning Group approval. The Interlocal Agreement is between participating entities and the San Antonio River Authority for five years. The participating entities have agreed to fund administrative costs, based on the approved budget each calendar year, incurred by the Administrator, on behalf of Region L activities. Mr. West made a motion to approve the Administrator to negotiate and execute the Interlocal Agreement for Funding of SB1 Region L Administrative Costs, 2012 – 2016 with participating entities. Evelyn Bonavita seconded the motion. The motion passed by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 10: Review/Approve Administrator's Budget for CY2012

Ms. Newberry reviewed the proposed administrator's budget for 2012 with the Pianning Group. The budget is operated on a calendar year basis. The Administrator has proposed the budget remain the same as the 2011 budget, \$58,000.00. Rick Iligner made a motion to approve the budget for 2012 at \$58,000.00. Mike Mahoney seconded the motion. The motion passed by consensus.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 11: Possible Agenda Items for the Next South Central Texas Regional Water Planning Group Meeting

AGENDA ITEM NO. 12: Set Dates and Times of Regional Water Planning Group Meetings for 2012

Mr. Mims asked the Planning Group if the quarterly dates provided in the agenda packet would suffice for 2012 meeting dates. There were no objections. Mr. Mims stated if concerns came up closer to those dates, specifically November 1, 2012, we would discuss at that time.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 13: Public Comment

Steve Raabe, SARA, handed out information for the Alamo Area Council of Government (AACOG) on a potential grant application within a few counties in Region L the AACOG will be applying for. Mr. Raabe stated if the representatives from the effected counties had questions, to please contact Brian Mast at SARA or Ms. Newberry.

Ms. Scott informed the Planning Group that Dr. Brownlow has been appointed by Governor Perry to represent Wilson County on the Board of Directors of the San Antonio River Authority.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned by consensus at 12:38 p.m.

On July 15, 2011, the Victoria County Groundwater Conservation District held a public meeting and reviewed the City of Victoria's groundwater exchange program. The City of Victoria informed the District that it had re-initiated the program on July 6, 2011 according to information provided by Mr. James and Mr. Short of the City of Victoria. In response, the Board of Directors of the Victoria County Groundwater Conservation District has directed that a letter be sent to both the City of Victoria and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality re-expressing their concern regarding the program.

When the groundwater exchange program was originally developed and initiated in 2009 by the City of Victoria, the District identified several issues that needed to be resolved. These issues were communicated to both the City of Victoria and TCEQ in writing in a letter dated October 16, 2009. At least one issue remains unresolved: the lack of appropriate TCEQ authorization under Chapter 26 of the Texas Water Code. The District has received a copy of a letter from TCEQ's South Texas Watermaster Program signed by Mr. Ramiro Garcia Jr., Area Director of Border and South Central Texas, TCEQ approving the groundwater exchange program under certain conditions. However, a letter from the Watermaster Program is insufficient to constitute proper authorization to discharge groundwater into a river. The Victoria County Groundwater Conservation District continues to request proper action by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to review and consider the legality of the discharge of groundwater by the City of Victoria into the Guadalupe River.

Desired Future Conditions of the Gulf Coast Aquifer

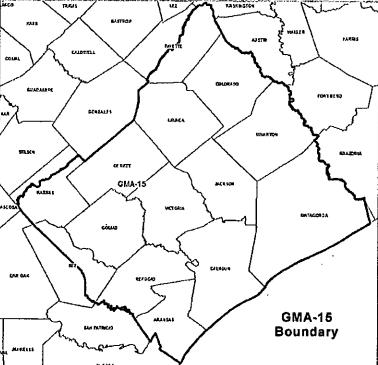
Following proper notice and a public hearing on July 14, 2010, the members of Groundwater Management Area 15 (GMA-15) adopted the initial Desired Future Condition (DFC) for the groundwater resources within its boundary. The GMA-15 DFC describes the maximum acceptable level

of aquifer drawdown for the Gulf Coast Aquifer as

"... groundwater within GMA
15 shall be managed in such a
way as to achieve a Desired
Future Condition in 2060 of no
more than 12 feet of average
drawdown of the Gulf Coast
Aquifer in the GMA 15 boundary relative to 1999 starting
conditions..."

GMA-15, not unlike most of the GMAs around the State, considered a wide range of issues and interests as it developed and adopted the GMA-15 DFC: urban interests, rural interests, historic groundwater uses, future groundwater uses, regional water planning needs, aquifer variability, droughts, and computer modeling limitations. The GMA-15 DFC represents the best solution to these issues for this region of the Gulf Coast. GMA-15 will revise, as necessary the DFC in five years, if not sooner.

With the submission of the GMA-15 DFC to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB), TWDB will compute available groundwater estimates referred to as Managed Available Groundwater (MAG) values for each county and supply those to the GCDs



within the GMA-15. The GCDs are required to incorporate the MAGs into their management and permitting programs.

Projected Population Growth and Water Needs

It's a fact recognized by most Texans: Texas is growing. The TWDB projects Texas' population at 2060 to be approximately 46 million. This estimate represents a 21 million person increase above the population projection for 2010. What is projected for Victoria County? Victoria County is growing as well with a projected population increase of 34% by 2060 compared to 2010 estimates (www.twdb.state.tx.us/wrpi/data/proj/2012popproj.asp). Along with the growth, Texas is realizing an increased demand for resources — especially in terms of water — for both personal use and industrial consumption. The table below summarizes the population, water demand, and water needs associated with the projected future growth in Victoria County (www.regionltexas.org/2011_rwp2.php).

Water Conservation Information and Suggestions

Water management strategies identified to help address the future shortfalls in the Region L 2011 regional water plan rightfully include water conservation. Water conservation is an environmentally-sensitive approach to managing water resources at the regional level; certain methods of water conservation are appropriate at the individual level in all areas of Texas such as proper maintenance of plumbing fixtures, effective lawn watering, shorter showers, and rainwater harvesting (www.twdb.state.tx.us/iwt/rainwater.asp).

Other water conservation approaches may only be appropriate on larger scales or particular geographic locations such as recharge enhancement (Section 4C.4 of the Region L 2011 Regional Water Plan).

Victoria County property owners may benefit from a variety of groundwater conservation or protection activities ranging from well maintenance to brush management. The maximum rate of withdrawal requested in the application would satisfy the spacing limitations established under VCGCD Rule 4.2 (50' property line offset, 1' of spacing per 1 GPM fro the nearest registered well) if the new well is drilled in a location that is at least 100 feet from the nearest property line.

Meeting Discussion: Mr. Andruss explained the following:

The District was near the end of an extensive records management project focused on organizing, indexing, and establishing retention parameters for records of the District. As of May 16, 2012, the District had 7,143 individual records indexed. The searching and retrieval of documents had been greatly improved but is a time-consuming process and requires the searcher to have detailed knowledge of the records management system. In addition, the system, like any indexing system, was vulnerable to mis-filed records through human error. To address these issues as well as deal with future space problems, the District had been investigating digital records storage and retrieval systems which resulted in a preliminary proposal being developed for the digitizing of physical records and indexing and storage in an online document retrieval system.

After completing an initial investigation of hosted document management services, DataBank IMX was contacted to explore more fully the services they could offer the District. DataBank IMX is a national service provider of imaging and information systems including data conversion, data hosting,

and online software services with full-text indexing/searching. DataBank IMX offered to develop a proof-of-concept project that focused on providing robust and effective indexing and searching features using VCGCD records. The proof-of-concept was successful. DataBank IMX would like to conduct a site visit to evaluate the conditions of the records, discuss potential conversion processes, and confirm assumptions used to develop the proposal pricing. The site visit has been postponed until the Board expresses an interest in the project and authorizes the general manager to continue the scoping and negotiation process.

DataBank IMX has proposed a solution that includes 5 online system users, storage of 250,000 images, system configuration, project implementation and testing, user training, and existing record conversion. The preliminary cost proposal is a one time \$3,950 fee for the professional services, a recurring fee of \$288/mo for system access, and a scanning fee of \$0.083 per page digitized by DataBank IMX.

Based on the functionality (full-text indexing, record cross-referencing, internet access to records, secondary backup of records, etc.) provided by the DataBank IMX solution and ability to begin to store records off-site with availability of digital records, the District will improve its efficiency and reduce the need for more space and filing cabinets.

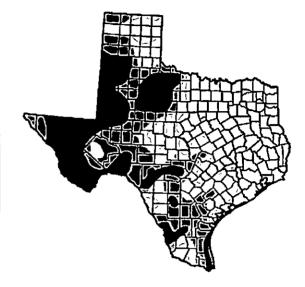
