Agenda Item 1: Call to order and welcome guests.

Mr. Andruss called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM. A guorum was present.

Attached to these minutes is a copy of the meeting attendance sheet.

No action was taken.

Agenda Item 2: Receive public comment.

Mr. Andruss offer to accept any public comments. Written and verbal comments regarding a potential groundwater development project by the City of Kennedy were provided by Mr. Terrell Graham and Ms. Tina Shearman.

No action was taken.

Agenda Item 3: Consideration of and possible action on matters related to the minutes of the previous meeting.

Mr. Andruss explained that the minutes of the previous meeting were sent to the GMA 15 representatives prior to this meeting.

Groundwater Management Area 15 Meeting Minutes

MOTION: Mr. Hudgins moved to approve the meeting minutes for May 11, 2017 as drafted. Mr. Van Dresar seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Agenda Item 4: Consideration of and possible action on matters related to budget and financial reports of Groundwater Management Area 15.

Mr. Andruss explained that the funds collected from member districts for the 2nd planning cycle had been exhausted and therefore no report regarding financial matters was developed.

No action was taken.

Agenda Item 5: Consideration of and possible action on reports and communication from Groundwater Management Area 15 member districts and Groundwater Management Area 15 representatives to Regional Water Planning Groups.

Mr. Dohmann notified the representatives that a study related to water levels in Goliad County has recently concluded. Mr. Dohmann offered to share the study report with the member districts upon acceptance of the study report by the Goliad County Groundwater Conservation District.

Mr. Andruss notified the representatives that the Calhoun County GCD has adopted a management plan and rules which were in effect on October 1, 2017.

Mr. Hudgins explained that Region P RWPG was reviewing water demand projections and would likely seek a revision to the method used to predict demand for irrigation purposes.

No action was taken.

Agenda Item 6: Consideration of and possible action on reports from Texas Water Development Board representatives to Groundwater Management Area 15 including GR-16-025.

Mr. Bradley of TWDB informed the GMA that 1) several key staff members of the TWDB were leaving the agency, 2) encouraged districts to consider submitting management plan amendments or newly adopted management plans to TWDB as soon as possible, and 3) staff at TWDB were working to revise the CGC-MAG improvement project schedule.

Mr. Andruss asked that TWDB provided the updated schedule for the CGC-MAG improvement project to the GMA when approved.

No action was taken.

Agenda Item 7: Consideration of and possible action on matters related to joint planning including the review of management plans and accomplishments of Groundwater Management Area 15 member districts.

Mr. Andruss explained that in August 2017, Art Dohmann of Goliad County GCD requested 1) the GMA consider holding a meeting during August and September to afford the representatives the opportunity to discuss a water well field being considered for development near the Goliad/Karnes County Line in the Evangeline Aquifer Component of the Gulf Coast Aquifer System and 2) the attendance of the GMA 15 Chair (Tim Andruss, Victoria County GCD General Manager) at Goliad County GCD meeting on August 14, 2017. A meeting was not scheduled in September due to complications resulting from Hurricane Harvey. Mr. Dohmann expressed concern that the subject well field could have a meaningful impact on the aquifer and the Desired Future Conditions of Goliad County and Karnes County.

At the Goliad County GCD meeting of August 14, 2017, the Board of Directors considered the project and received a considerable public input regarding the matter. Mr. Andruss attended the meeting and commented on the role of GMA 15 and the adopted DFCs.

Mr. Andruss contacted Mr. Labus, General Manager of the Evergreen Underwater Conservation District, and requested that he attend this meeting and provided a summary of the subject project to the GMA 15 representatives.

Mr. Labus provided a summary of the permitting activities and the status of the test well project. Attendees offered comments and questions regarding the project.

The representatives agreed to continue the discussion of the matter at the next GMA 15 meeting.

Agenda Item 8: Consideration of and possible action on administrative and organizational matters of Groundwater Management Area 15.

Mr. Andruss explained that during the 2nd Cycle of Joint Planning and DFC development, the GMA members adopted administrative procedures, by-laws and a cost-sharing agreement. The administrative procedures and by-laws remain in effect. The cost-sharing agreement has expired. In addition, the Victoria County GCD entered into an agreement with Intera Inc on behalf of the GMA to secure the technical consulting services provided during 2nd cycle of planning.

If the member districts wish to secure technical consulting services for the 3rd cycle of planning, a new cost-sharing agreement would have to be approved along with the necessary tasks to identify and secure desired services. During the 2nd cycle, the technical services were limited to two broad categories: modeling of pumping scenarios and explanatory report development.

During the recent legislative session, HB 2215 was passed. HB 2215 modified Section 36.108 of the Texas Water Code. In particular, HB 2215 revised certain deadlines related to the DFC development process. TWC 36.108(d) establishes May 1, 2021 as the deadline considering information and proposing a DFC for adoption. TWC 36.108(d-3) establishes January 5, 2022 as the deadline to finally adopt DFCs.

For the purposes of aiding representatives considering how to proceed, the following lists the major steps to be completed during the planning cycle:

Step 1 - Districts submit one or more DFC Proposal to GMA 15

Step 2 - GMA 15 designates one or more DFC Proposal as DFC For Consideration

Step 3 - GMA 15 considers impacts anticipated by any DFC For Consideration

Step 4 - GMA 15 designates one or more DFC For Consideration as DFC For Distribution

Step 5 - Districts consider one or more DFC For Distribution and submit District Summaries to GMA 15

Step 6 - GMA 15 considers District Summaries

Step 7 - GMA 15 designates one or more DFC For Consideration as DFC Proposed For Adoption (DEADLINE May 1, 2021)

Step 8 - GMA 15 adopts one or more DFC Proposed For Adoption as GMA 15 DFC (DEADLINE January 5, 2022)

Step 9 - GMA 15 produces GMA 15 DFC, Explanatory Report, and supporting documentation

Mr. Andruss agreed to develop and present draft cost-sharing agreements and other documents needing review by the GMA to initiate the process of obtaining a technical consultant for the 3rd cycle of DFC planning.

Agenda Item 9: Consideration of and possible action on identification and scheduling of future agenda items and meetings.

Mr. Andruss explained that the next meeting of the GMA is scheduled for January 11,2 017. The location of the meeting would be determined at a later date.

Agenda Item 10: Receive public comment.

Groundwater Database Stakeholder Meeting (9:00 AM – 12:00 PM)

TAGD invites interested stakeholders to join us in a discussion about groundwater databases. The objective of the meeting will be to assess how groundwater data is currently collected and organize, and to consider the benefits and challenges of a central repository for data collection.

Good morning. My name is Terrell Graham. We live in northern Goliad county near the county line with Karnes county. Since we are in Goliad County GCD, we can get a permit to pump up to ½ acre-foot of groundwater per acre we own. A well-reasoned amount. Our neighbor right next to us in the Evergreen UWCD can get a permit for 2 acre-feet per acre they own. We can drawdown the aquifer 10 feet. Our neighbor can drawdown the aquifer 50 feet. Goliad limits the flow rate we can pump at, by depth of screening. Evergreen does not. There isn't anything different about our properties. The topography, geology hydrology, etc. are the same. The only real difference is a political boundary. The science is the same.

For the year 2020 the modeled available groundwater for the Gulf Coast Aquifer within Evergreen UWCD is 3,235 acre-feet per year. For 2020 the modeled available groundwater for the Gulf Coast Aquifer within Goliad GCD is 11,699 acre-feet per year. By only comparing the modeled available groundwater for Goliad and Evergreen, we should be able to pump 3.6 times as much groundwater as our neighbor in Karnes county. This is an oversimplification of the issue.

What is being discussed doesn't make any scientific sense. It is not a just and equitable distribution of ground water. It is a capricious and arbitrary distribution of groundwater, decided by an arbitrary political boundary without any basis in science. Our neighbor just a short distance away is entitled to 4 times as much groundwater as we are. Our neighbor can drawdown our shared aquifer 5 times as much as we can. Our neighbor can pump at any rate he chooses to. We can't.

I respectfully request that GMA 15 consider this matter and see if more uniformity can be had between the various districts within GMA 15 to achieve a more just and equitable distribution of the groundwater in the Gulf Coast aquifer. Many of our neighbors have property in both Goliad and Karnes counties. Without some uniformity in rules between members of GMA 15, many questions will be asked in the near future. Distribution of groundwater should be based solely upon unbiased science, not arbitrary political subdivisions, with an overall goal of conservation for present and future generations.

Our concerns are based on experience from the past, for the most part we do not have recorded data, or scientific evidence. However we have all experienced well issues. They have ranged from pumping excessive sand to total failure. The cause was from some irrigation wells in the vicinity. When the wells were shut-in, most of our wells recovered. The springs and live creeks in the area DID NOT! The volume of water harvested by these wells was nothing compared to the projected water draw proposed by the city of Kenedy.


We strongly object to this project due to the impact it will have on us personally as well as the economic impact it will have on the city of Kenedy and land values in the area. Land with no water has very little value, therefore will be devalued in the county tax base.
